From our Pastor's desk....

My Dear Toti Family,

Every tomorrow has two handles: the handle of anxiety and the handle of faith. Which will you use to get a "handle" on *your* day?

Second only to the fear of standing before a large audience is the commonly expressed phobia known as "fear of the unknown". In a day when pressing problems greatly outnumber available solutions in matters of national and international concern, where do you turn for stability in an increasingly unstable world?

You turn to the same Refuge the psalmist found.

In Psalm 46 the sons of Korah portray the worst calamities imaginable upon earth: earthquakes, mudslide, turmoil on land and sea (vv 2-3). And when everything seems to be breaking loose, they discover there remains an immovable Refuge: the God of Jacob.

Before you close your Bible today, follow the instructions of verse 10. Remove as many distractions as possible and take a few minutes to be still before the Lord. Turn over to him any fears you may be harbouring; then write down the words of Psalm 46:10 on a three-by-five card and carry them with you throughout the day. When fear, like acid, begins to eat away at your peace of mind, pull out your reminder from the sons of Korah and refresh your memory. Your Refuge is "the same yesterday, today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8)

PSALM 46

God is our refuge and strength, a tested help in times of trouble. And so we need not fear even if the world blows up and the mountains crumble into the sea. Let the oceans roar and foam; let the mountains tremble! There is a river of joy flowing through the City of our God – the sacred home of the God above all gods. God himself is living in that city; therefore it stands unmoved despite the turmoil everywhere. He will not delay his help. The nations rant and rave in anger – but when God speaks, the earth melts in submission and kingdoms totter into ruin. The Commander of the armies of heaven is here among us. He, the God of Jacob, has come to rescue us.

Come, see the glorious things that our God does, how he brings ruin upon the world and causes wars to end throughout the earth, breaking and burning every weapon. "Stand silent! Know that I am God! I will be honoured by every nation in the world!"
