### From our Pastor's desk....

My Dear Toti Family,

Martin Luther summarized the Psalms with these words: "In the Psalms we looked into the heart of all the saints, and we seem to gaze into fair pleasure gardens – into heaven itself, indeed – where blooms in sweet, refreshing, gladdening flowers of holy and happy thoughts about God and all His benefits." Perhaps that's been your experience as well as you've walked through the pages of the Bible's hymnbook.

Today, let's stop and rest once again by lingering over Psalm 60, in which David responds to the vents filling his life at the time. See what parallels you can draw with your own life as you read. What was the best piece of good news you received in the last year? What was the worst piece of bad news? Have you ever had someone come to you with the bittersweet statement, "I have good news and bad news...."? Which did you want to hear first? Psalm 60 was written in the aftermath of both good news and bad news for King David. At the peak of his power, David enjoyed victory over his foes near and far (2 Samuel 8:3-5). (That's the good news.) But David's sweeping success in battle caused his enemies to join forces through alliances. This psalm indicates that Edom attacked Judah from the south, bringing havoc on David's thinly defended homeland. (That's the bad news). After hearing the bleak report, David sat down to capture his emotions in a Spirit-inspired song: Psalm 60.

David clearly recognized the sovereign hand of God in what had happened. Not only does God move in the affairs of men; He possesses the very nations (vv. 7-8)! Therefore, David could glory in God's mighty strength, knowing that "With God's help we shall do mighty things" (v. 12) – a confidence you can echo today. Find a pencil and complete these two sentences:

"As I look at my circumstances, the bad news is ....." "As I look at the resources of God, the good news is ....." PSALM 60

O God, you have rejected us and broken our defenses; you have become angry and deserted us. Lord, restore us gain to your favour. 2. You have caused this nation to tremble in fear; you have torn it apart. Lord, heal it now, for it is shaken to its depths. 3.You have been very hard on us and made us reel beneath your blows. 4,5But you have given us a banner to rally to; all who love truth will rally to it; then you can deliver your beloved people. Use you strong right arm to rescue us. 6,7God has promised to help us. He has vowed it by his holiness! No wonder I exult! "Shechem, Succoth, Gilead, Manasseh – still are mine!" he says. "Judah shall continue to produce kings, and Ephraim great warriors. 8. Moab shall become my lowly servant, and Edom my slave. And I will shout in triumph over the Philistines." 9,10 Who will bring me in triumph into Edom's strong cities? God will! He who cast us off! He who abandoned us to our foes! 11.Yes, Lord, help us against our enemies, for man's help is useless. 12. With God's help we shall do might things, for he will trample down our foes."

#### RESPONSE:

"Heavenly Father, that phrase rings in my ears: 'With God's help we shall do mighty things.' David could say that in the face of an uncertain battle. Help me say it as well in the uncertain battles of my own life. I want to be your instrument to do mighty things in my world today. Please cleanse me, use me, and give me confidence in your victory – just as you did David. In the name of my Saviour. Amen."
